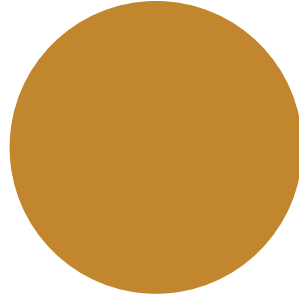




# The School Counselor's Role
